

The Historic sign tells about our depot. It was built in 1869 and has the distinguished honor of being the largest Board & Batten Depot. It was built by the New York Oswego Midland Railroad. It's size shows how important New Berlin was to the railroad at that time. The year was 1869 on this Historic Marker, but the start for this project was actually in 1868 when the "Midland" began building. The New York & Oswego Midland Railroad (O & W's precessor) was the grandiose Vision of DeWhitt Littlejohn, a dynamic politician whose concept of a rail route across NYS serving virgin territory seemed logical. As "Midland" began building and making its way thru towns which had put up money for its construction, the cost far exceeded estimates, and within a month of completion the Midland was bankrupt. But it survived and was reorganized in 1880 as the New York, Ontario & Western Railway.

It lasted until March 29th 1957 when it was ordered liquidated by a US bankruptcy judge. The O & W holds the distinction of being the first major U S railroad to be abandoned in its entirety.



## JOHN TAIBI GUEST SPEAKER



Our June guest speaker was John Taibi, author and preserver of railroad history, who lives in a home that was once the Munnsville railroad depot, similar to the depot where the Unadilla Valley Railway Museum is housed now. John gave a presentation about four railroad families who were part of that industry spanning the entire life of railroading in our area.

Thanks to much documentation, literature and photos offered for his use by Bob Collins of Norwich, John was able to share many railroad stories from the John Fagan collection about the Fagan, Batie, Collins and King Families who worked for the NYO&W and who as engineers of the day would have frequented the depot in New Berlin.

John's book entitled "Delaware and Hudson" containing more than 120 short stories will be coming out this fall. He will continue writing books about the history of the railroad and the people that supported it among which are the Engineers, Conductors, Station Agents, Trainmen, Firemen, Station and Train service people. He spoke of the Brotherhood of Railway Firemen and Engineers and the family trees of these four families as they chose their professions, began, were promoted, honored and retired with many wonderful photographs of the era.

John was pleased to receive a UVRS&M hat and appreciation from all who attended as questions were answered and refreshments were served.

Our records show that John has been our guest speaker on five occasions and has been a member of the UVRS&Museum since 1996.

John lived in Franklin, NY when he joined us. He has been instrumental in bringing railroad "buffs" to visit our beautiful historic board and batten depot with its huge beams and to see our Museum as it has grown through the years. Some of John Taibi's books published over the years include; "O & W" The long life and slow Death of the New York, Ontario & Western

Railway": "Remembering the New York Ontario & Western Railway (Oswego to Sidney & Branches" Rails Along the Oriskany" and John's fifth book on the O & W was "The Ontario & Western Northern Division"

The station once served the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western (on the Richfield Springs branch) and the short line Unadilla Valley Railroad. The depot has been restored by the Bridgewater Historical Society.

The station is located on the north side of Route 20 a short distance east of the intersection with NY Route 8. Several people attended including people from other states including our member William Young from PA. He brought Hank and Roz Sommers from Vestal NY with him. Refreshments were enjoyed by all.

### Exciting News from Lance Erickson.....

Lance sends word about his hopes of riding the New Saratoga and North Creek Railroad this fall..

The first two passenger cars for a scenic Saratoga and North Creek Railway have reached the Spa City, and locomotives are on their way. Meanwhile, train operator Iowa Pacific Holdings LLC signed a formal contract with rail line owners, the town of Corinth and Warren County, at the historic North Creek train station in early June. Tourist trains are expected to start running sometime during the first two weeks of July, 2011. "We're still working through the regulatory approvals," said Ed Ellis, president of Chicago-based Iowa Pacific. "Everybody's working to get it done. We want to do it right"

Iowa Pacific operates several other excursion trains,

The two dome cars that arrived in Saratoga Springs this week are from its West Texas & Lubbock Railway. Two locomotives are en route from Colorado and East St. Louis and should arrive early next week. A third locomotive is currently being worked on at Rock Island, Ill.

Eventually, the overall operation will have four or five locomotives and five passenger cars. The scenic railroad's website (www.sncrr.com) is available for viewing, but it is still under construction. People may also visit the website www.iowapacific.com.

When this excursion train starts operating, the members of the UVRS&M will plan a group ride.

## THE BABY RAILROAD BY

Ernest Clemens

Last issue of the Pendragon told about Rev. Ernest Clemens booklet. We sold out right away of the little picture booklet about the Short line railroads and asked Ernie if he had more. Today he brought 25 more copies that he ran off on his home equipment and donated them so more people interested could not be left out. This less than 20 pages with 25 pictures taken in part from the 1938 Fall issue of the Fortune Magazine is indeed interesting reading.

The booklet is centered about the Unadilla Valley. As history this 72 year old glimpse into our short line railroad does bring back a lot of memories. The following is from his first page. "Those of us who have lived, and seen the "Dilly Dally" rolling up, or down the valley are warmed with nostalgia. We can call to mind the sound of the mournful whistle, the wafting smoke spiraling up and trailing back and dissipating in the air, the "clacking" of the wheels as they passed over each rail joint and the wave of the engineer, fireman or brakeman as you passed the train or it passed you...and very seldom the latter.

Can the reader recall the number of blasts from that whistle when the train was backing up?

Can you remember the sound of that whistle as a warning when the train approached a crossing?

Did you ever have to wait as the slow moving engine, string of cars and caboose crossed at Sweets crossing... or the joy and laughter of the kids in the car as the train ran parallel to route 8 along side your car? Or, can you remember riding from any point on the line to another and feel the rocking and rolling of that passenger car, or the soot seeping in around the windows and doors?

If you have enjoyed this bit of yesterday in your memory read on... This era will never return. We have lost so much from "days that used to be." Businesses that once flourished have closed their doors forever. Those of you who have "come to age" have something that our youth can never know, and even if your bones creak and rheumatism takes its toll on you everyday, you are blessed to have known those wonderful days."
