This shot is taken in West Edmeston, just South of the hi-way crossing. The Ice house is in the far Background (long gone), the Milk station, (still standing but not shown), was across the tracks Left, from the Ice house. The "West Ed" Station, in the immediate background at right, (a private home now). To the right of the station, you can see the highway bridge girder, which spans the Unadilla river. The switch the train is crossing, is to the GLF feed store, (long gone). Behind and to the right, (which the road to the right of the station connects to). The train, (engine cab end), is Facing



South, towards New Berlin, 12mi away. The end is near as the locomotive has been repainted and the Final run was Nov. 1960. I lived there as a young kid and fondly remember the railroad, I was 11 when it was taken up.
