

#### DEDICATION TO WILLIAM S. YOUNG



Mr. William S. Young will always be remembered as a very special Life Member, Guest Speaker, Author and Historian with a love for the Unadilla Valley Railroad and other short line railroads.

Mr. Young passed away on August 8th, 2012 in Susquehanna County, PA. His family and friends gathered at his home to pay tribute to this extraordinary man.

"Bill" as we called him, lived in a charming home filled with his many rail-

road books and memorabilia surrounded by his collections of artifacts rail articles and hobbies. It was easy to see and imagine him there comfortably writing to his many friends and completing yet another book. Four members of the Unadilla Valley Railway Society and Museum attended this event, Mike Holdridge of Williamsburg, PA, Hezekiah Welch and Pat Gifford of New Berlin, and Laurie Hotaling of Norwich, NY.

In his last published book, 'UV the Life and Times of a Small Railroad, a Definitive Account of the Unadilla Valley Railway' he has 12 wonderful chapters all about The Unadilla Valley and railroad days long gone. A quote in the first paragraph of his book "The gestation period for this book, sixty-five years, may set some kind of dubious record. A letter to me dated June 1, 1944, from L. L. Schomo, superintendent of motive power and equipment for the Unadilla Valley Railway at New Berlin. NY. shows that at age fifteen I already wanted to tell his railroad's story. I had written him to explain this and to ask if I could have a ride on the UV. I didn't say how old I was." Bill peddled 67 miles to New Berlin on a one speed bicycle on September 4th, 1945. When reading about his trip and the very interesting remarks about our familiar villages, towns and

rivers, one cannot put his book down ... you just feel like reading all 12 chapters without stopping. His book is enhanced with more than 60 pictures, 15 maps and approximately 700 people that are named and listed in the Personal-Name Index as well as a list of about 50 people hired before 1900.

Bill spent many hours organization, collating, and binding his book to save cost for us to be able to purchase his books at a very reasonable price of only \$20. The work he did on each book would have doubled the cost to us if he had hired it done.

Personal letters from Bill to our director, Pat Gifford, showed his heart felt love for our members. After traveling way up here from his home in Starrucca Creek Road PA early in May, 2010 he wrote. Thank you everyone for your kind hospitality last Saturday. It was a most enjoyable time for me, I appreciated very much being able to review the Jenkins/Brome papers."

He took time to advise us about filing for tax exempt status with the IRS that needed to be done by May 17th 2010, otherwise they could cancel our tax exemption. In recent mail and phone calls we are advised of the following from William (Bill) Young's family that he is continually thinking about us. His Last Will and Testament states "I give and bequeath to the UNADILLA VALLEY RAILWAY SOCIETY AND MUSEUM. New Berlin. New York. All of my photographs, papers, and artifacts relating to the Unadilla Valley Railway, along with my copyright to the book UV (The Life and Times of a Small Railroad)." This gift is a huge asset to our organization. This Spring his family plan on coming to New Berlin to tour the Museum and present us with his legacy to the UVRR which he was enamored with thought his life.

### News from Michael Holdridge about the Unadilla Valley Locomotive GE 70 Ton Diesel now available for Model collectors

To those of you that always wished there was a model of the locomotive that operated on your favorite railroad, the Unadilla Valley Railway, your wish has finally come true.

Bachmann Trains, now offers in "HO"(1/87th scale), an operating model of the same type of locomotive that operated on the Unadilla Valley Railway, a GE 70 Ton Diesel.

This locomotive comes in a variety of paint schemes, but Bachmann Trains item number 60611 comes already

painted in the familiar cream & orange w/black trim, paint scheme that was used on our UV # 200 & earlier UV #100 GE 70 ton diesels.

The Salzburg acquisition of shortline railroads, were at one time, seen in the states of Louisiana, Arkansas, Iowa, Pennsylvania, Vermont, and our own New York State, of which there was the Unadilla Valley, Jamestown Westfield & North Western, and the Southern New York railroads. These Saltzburg railroads that

had GE 70 tonners were all basically painted the same cream & orange w/black trim scheme that is pictured.

The locomotive model comes unlettered in road name. so it can be decaled by the modeler for their specific road name the modeler is interested in. Right now Unadilla Valley Railway Co. decals were available several years ago, but right now they are pretty hard to find. It is to be remembered though, that in the last year of the UV railroad, the locomotive was repainted but not re-lettered in the large letters on the sides of the engine hood. Work is being done by Piney Creek Model Works, to make decal sets for the UV and the other Salzburg shortlines that operated GE 70 Tonners, in the cream and orange paint scheme, available again.

Working with Bachmann to provide the information for the Salzburg paint scheme on the GE 70 Tonner locomotive was a pretty interesting project, and they are the only manufacturer that currently offers a plastic ready to run "HO" model of the GE 70 ton diesel(s) that operated from late in the year when they were delivered new to the UV railroad, of 1947, with UV#200 continuing its ment in November of 1960, on our UV trackage.


