Come Join Us On A Road Trip

Be part of the fun on Saturday, June 16th, 2018, when UVRS&M members and friends go on a road trip to Franklin, New York, to visit the Franklin Railroad and Community Museum in Franklin, New York.

Walter Rich was a long-time Franklin and area railroad executive, who died in 2007. The centerpiece of the museum is a railroad car that was delivered to the site shortly after Rich died. The museum was built around it. There are tracks leading out of the building so it can be moved for community events.

First opened in December, 2013, the museum is located at 572 Main St, Franklin NY, behind the National Bank of Delaware County. Turn into the driveway between the bank and the Town Clerk's office and park in front of the museum. Donations are encouraged, but there is no specific admission charge.

We'll meet at our museum at 10 Railroad St in New Berlin and leave by carpool at noon to arrive at the Franklin Museum for a 1:00 PM arrival. Or meet us there. We'll perhaps have time to take in a couple of local antique stores in Franklin afterwards. Then we're talking about stopping at Brooks Barbeque in Oneonta on the way back for a chicken dinner.

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Membership Renewal Update


As a result of our recent Membership Renewal Campaign, we now have the following members: 35 Life (with 2 more that we don't have addresses for), 3 Conductors, 1 Engineer, 10 Firemen and 20 Brakemen for a total of 71 with 7 additional people who have not yet renewed their membership for 2018. 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Take A Train Ride This Summer

Cooperstown & Charlotte Valley Railroad—

They run Easter Bunny Express trains during March, Blues Express trains every Saturday night through the warmer months and regular excursions on Thursdays from Milford NY to The Cooperstown Dreams Park and Cooperstown. Round trip tickets start at \$17. Note that the C&CV RR also has a Guest Engineer Program where you can learn how to and actually drive a locomotive, for a fee. The railroad is based in Milord, about 30 miles (45 minutes) from New Berlin. Address: 136 E Main St, Milford, NY 13807. Phone: 607-432-2429. Web site: www.lrhs.com/.



Adirondack Scenic Railroad—They have Easter Bunny trains, Fall Foilage trains, Beer & Wine trains, trains from Utica to Thendara (near Old Forge) with a layover or with an extension to Big Moose. The Big Moose and Thendara trips are all-day affairs leaving at 9:30 AM and returning at 7:00 PM starting at \$39.50. The railroad is based at Utica's Union Station, 321 Main St, Utica, about 40 miles (50 minutes) from New Berlin. Phone: 800-819-2291. Web site: http://www.adirondackrr.com/adkrr/



Delaware & Ulster Railroad—Round trips are 24 miles from Arkville to Roxbury and take about 2 hours. Much of the route parallels the East Branch of the Delaware River with the Catskill mountains in the background. Their full schedule for 2018 is not yet available, but they offer twilight music trains, light-hearted train robbery trains, lunch or dinner dining in the dome dining car and regular excursion trains. Round trip ticket prices start at \$18. The railroad is based in Arkville NY, about 75 miles from New Berlin (an hour and a half) via NY-23 and NY-28. Catskill Mountain Railroad—They run an Easter Bunny Express, Fall Foilage, Pumpkin Patch and Polar Express trains as well as the Catskill Mountain Flyer scheduled during the summer months. Round trips take about an hour. Round trip tickets start at \$14. The railroad is based at Westbrook Lane Station locat-



Saratoga & North Creek Railroad—They run snow trains and Polar Express trains, as well as regularly scheduled excursion trains during the summer months in regular passenger cars or dome observation cars. The railroad is based in Saratoga Springs, about 110 miles (2 and 1/4 hours) from New Berlin. It's about 50 miles to North Creek. Their full schedule for 2018 is not yet available. Arcade & Attica Railroad—They run a large number of special trains pulled by a real steam engine from Arcade NY to Currier's Station, about 7 miles away. A regular trip takes two and a half hours with a layover at Currier's station to look through their museum. Ticket start at \$19. The railroad is based in Arcade NY, about 220 miles (3 and 3/4 hours) from New Berlin. Address: 278 Main St, Arcade, NY 14009. Phone: 585-492-3100. Web site: https://www.aarailroad.com/



Steamtown—This is a National Historic Site run by the National Park Service. They have a large museum with LOTS of steam locomotives plus excursion trains to four different destinations and a locomotive shop tour (which is highly recommended) a gift shop and book store and programs that change monthly.. Excursion tickets start at \$5 and go up to \$54. There is no entrance fee to the museum and grounds. Plan to stay all day, there are lots of things to see and do. Many of the exhibits are outdoors, so watch the weather. Steamtown is located about 115 miles (2 and 1/4 hours) from New Berlin. Address: 150 South Washington Avenue. 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Autumn Adventure of Herby Whipple and Sandy Kilmer

Last October 21, 2017, two New Berlin train enthusiasts ventured out amid the glowing fall foliage that highlighted a daylong excursion beginning with a 6:50 a.m. departure, three and half hour bus ride originating in Norwich taking them and their 35-40 companions for the day stopping just short of Attica due to flooding.

Following a wonderful lunch at Chanderson's Steak & Seafood Restaurant the bus was reboarded for the 100th anniversary of the Arcade & Attica Railroad with a three hour ride on a 1940 vintage steam engine train a bit further north than peak foliage.

The whole trip was fantastic. The conductor and crew were friendly and informative. They allowed the crowd to examine the engine and cab up close and willingly answered questions politely and with interest. The train is well maintained and fun to experience what travel was like 50 to 100 years ago. The passenger cars were made 100 years ago.

A stop at the Curriers Station Ticket office where snacks and souvenirs were available and by 3:00 p.m. the adventure continued on the bus ride home while following a stop at McDonald's on Rte 81 for supper they needed to wait for an ambulance to aide a gentleman with diabetes who was in distress. However, another traveler and his wife provided accordion music and many enjoyed the singing of old time songs.

Our travelers are planning a spring trip out of Milford and would welcome others to join in the fun. Also thinking ahead to an August 22, 2018, ride in vintage coaches built as early as 1917 pulled by diesel engines with narrated round-trip along the Lehigh River over bridges, through Glen Onoko, and into the Lehigh Gorge State Park where you will see high-rising cliffs, mountain scenery, and wildlife along the forested route to Old Penn Haven.



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The Unadilla Valley Railroad in South New Berlin

South New Berlin is located about 6 miles south of New Berlin. At one time, "South Town" was the third largest community on the New Berlin Branch (after New Berlin and Mt. Upton). It had a very active business community with feed, lumber, oil, coal and milk dealers.

The original South New Berlin depot was built by the New York & Oswego Midland Railroad in 1869. It was destroyed by fire in 1892 and then rebuilt. The New Berlin Branch and all depots on the line were bought by the Unadilla Valley Railroad in 1941. The depot was active until the UV shut down in 1960. The depot no longer exists today.

The I. L. Richer Company was formed in 1870 as a feed dealer and was a staple of many small towns up and down the Unadilla and surrounding valleys. It was a major shipper on the UV for many years. The last remaining parts of the company were sold to the Blue Seal Company of NH in 2008.

The former milk plant now houses the Timber-brook Woodworking Company, which makes a number of specialized wood products. (Submitted by Tom DeForest)






